

Florida Scrub-jay Photo Cache



Instructions:

- * This photo cache requires a camera or smart phone but not GPS capabilities.
- * It can be fully accessible on paved areas or can include offroad. The activity can include travel throughout the park ~ by car, bike, horse, rollerblades, or foot - your choice! You can rent bikes at the park's concession in the River Area.
- Using a GPS or smart phone, find the coordinates listed for each question; or follow the hints on the back page. Be sure to take a map!
- 2. Find the answer to at least 3 questions and take a picture of what you find or where you are.
- 3. Some answers can be found at more than one location (not at exact coordinates).



4. If you didn't see a scrub-jay how about a gopher tortoise? They also survive and thrive on open sandy habitat created by regular prescribed fire. Where does a gopher tortoise make it's home?

!Please do not get close to the burrow, it may scare the tortoise away from its home!

2. Where the path meets the tracks... where do Florida scrub-jays live and where is the best place to see one in the park? N 26' 59.952 W 080' 06.468



Scrub-jays love the scrub habitat with lots of small oak trees and open areas created by regular prescribed fire.

5. Like all wildlife, Florida scrub-jays have predators too... Osprey are eat mostly fish but are known to eat other things too. Red-shouldered hawks are common predators to scrub-jays. Look and listen... you are very likely to see or hear an osprey here! N 26' 59.537 W 080' 09.060



3. Find a Florida scrub-jay! While you are here, look around and see if you can find one. They like to hang out in the bushes, on the ground, and in dead trees (aka snags). Please remember they are wild animals and do not feed or disturb them.
